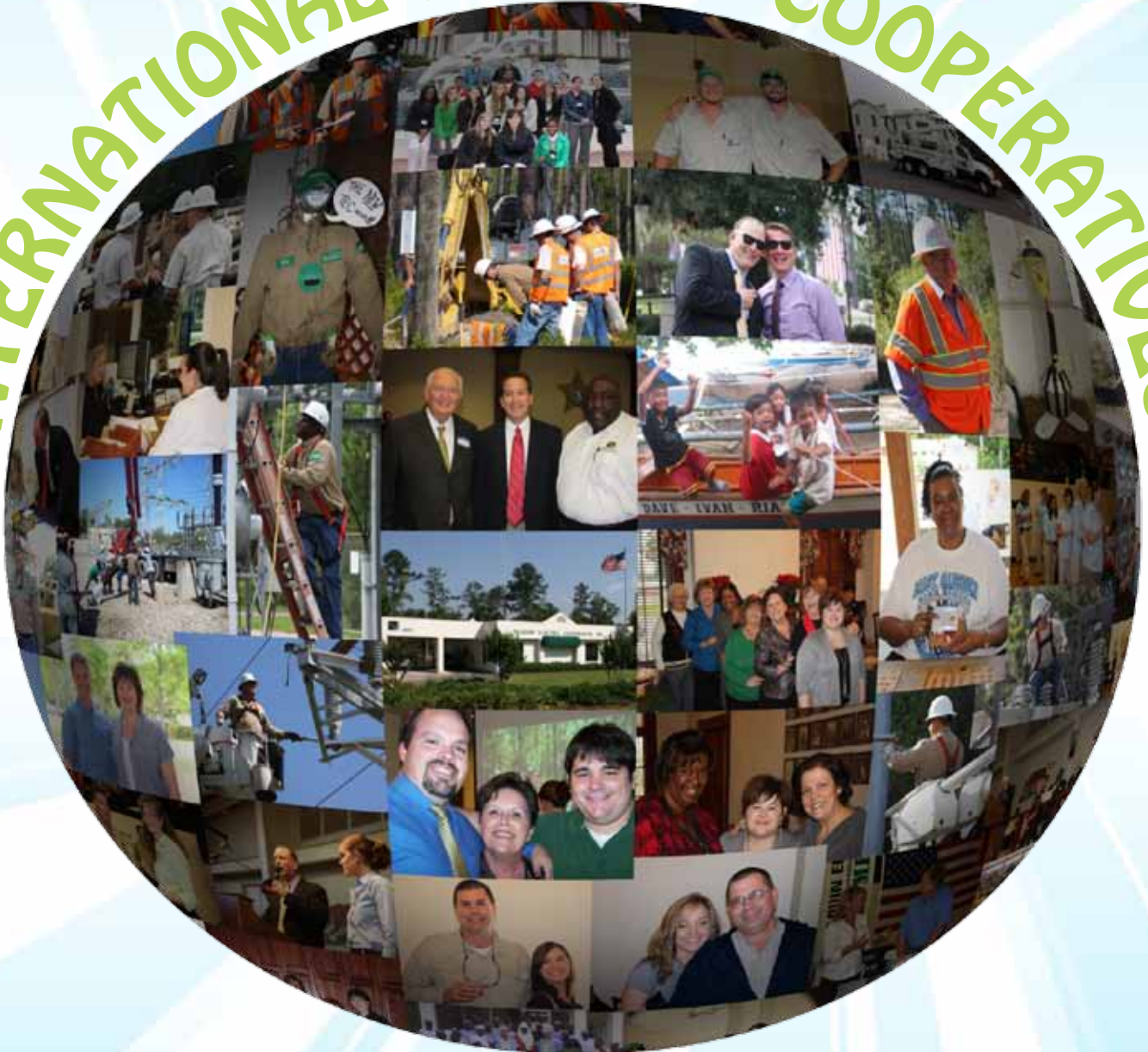

Manager's Column

This month electric cooperatives around the country are celebrating International Year of the Cooperative. To celebrate this event, we're taking a look at the important role co-ops play in our community. Cooperatives are owned by their members—the people who receive services from them—and are found in many industries. For example, more than 900 electric co-ops serve 42 million Americans. The cooperative movement traces its roots back to a store started by weavers in the town of Rochdale, England in 1844. The Rochdale model revolved around a set of guidelines drawn up by one of its members, Charles Howarth. When introduced into the U.S. by the National Grange in 1874, these “Rochdale Principles” fueled a cooperative explosion. Although stated in many ways, the Rochdale Principles hold that a cooperative must provide:

1. **Voluntary And Open Membership:** Membership in a cooperative is available to all who can reasonably use its services, regardless of race, religion, sex, or economic circumstances.
2. **Democratic Member Control:** Co-ops are democratically controlled, with each member having one vote. As a result, control remains in the hands of all customers. Directors are elected from the membership.
3. **Members' Economic Participation:** Cooperatives provide services “at cost” and remain not-for-profit regardless of the value of benefits delivered. Any money left over after all expenses are paid—margins—belongs to the members. Each member's share in the margin is determined by the amount of his or her use of the co-op's services.
4. **Autonomy and Independence:** Cooperatives are self-sustaining, self-help organizations controlled by their members. If cooperatives enter into agreements with others or raise money from outside sources, they do so on terms that maintain democratic control as well as their unique identity.
5. **Education, Training, and Information:** Keeping members, directors, managers, and employees up to date on issues so they can effectively govern the co-op. Communication, particularly with young members and opinion leaders, helps generate necessary public support for cooperatives.
6. **Cooperation among Cooperatives:** Mutual support helps cooperatives improve services, bolster local economies, and deal more effectively with social and community needs.
7. **Concern for Community:** Cooperatives develop communities with programs supported by the membership.

USING COMPACT FLUORESCENT LIGHT BULBS SAFELY

Handling

- Always take care when removing the bulb from its packaging, installing, or replacing it.
- Hold the bulb by its base and not the glass part.
- Never forcefully twist the CFL into a light socket. If it breaks, follow the tips below



Recycling or Disposal

- The Environmental Protection Agency recommends that consumers recycle CFLs. Local recycling options are listed at www.epa.gov/bulbrecycling or www.earth911.org. Home Depot also accepts intact light bulbs for recycling.
- If the state or local agency allows consumers to put CFLs in the garbage, the bulbs should be sealed in two plastic bags and put into the outside trash or other protected outside option.
- Never put a fluorescent light bulb or other mercury-containing product into an incinerator.
- If the bulb burns out before it should, contact the manufacturer. ENERGY STAR qualified bulbs are required to offer at least a two-year warranty.

Cleaning Up If a Bulb Should Break

- Open a window and have people (including you) and pets leave the room for at least 15 minutes.
- Shut off central forced air heating/cooling system.
- If the bulb is broken on a hard surface, carefully scoop up glass fragments and powder using stiff paper or cardboard and place them in a glass jar (with metal lid) or sealed plastic bag.
- Use sticky tape to pick up any remaining pieces and powder.
- Wipe the area clean with damp paper towels or disposable wet wipes. Place wipes in the glass jar or plastic bag.
- Do not use a vacuum or broom to clean up the broken bulb on hard surfaces.
- Immediately place all clean up materials outdoors in a trash container or protected area for trash pickup.
- Wash your hands after disposing of the materials.
- Check with your local or state government about disposal requirements in your specific area. Some states require broken and unbroken mercury-containing bulbs be taken to a recycling center.

ROASTED GARLIC MASHED POTATOES

Ingredients

- * 5 pounds Russet or Yukon Gold potatoes, peeled
- * 3 heads to 5 heads roasted garlic
- * 1-1/2 stick regular salted butter (3/4 cup)
- * 8 ounces, weight softened cream cheese
- * 1/2 cup or so half-and-half
- * Salt to taste
- * Black pepper to taste

Preparation Instructions

Cut the peeled potatoes into pieces and cook in boiling water until fork-tender. Drain water and return to pot, and mash potatoes over low heat until lots of the steam has escaped. Next, mash in softened butter, cream cheese, half-and-half, and salt to taste. Dump in three to five heads of roasted garlic cloves; stir together, then check seasoning. Be sure to salt adequately. Add some fresh ground black pepper, and serve with one or two roasted garlic cloves on top.

If you accidentally drop ice cubes when filling your glass from the freezer, don't throw them in the sink. Drop them in a house plant instead.
