rural communities across the nation. Citizens were able to band together and finally bring electricity to their rural areas. Our mission has not changed: our purpose is still to power communities and empower our Members to improve the quality of their lives.

One of the ways Talquin helps empower our Members is by supporting local organizations that assist those in need in our community. Since 2012, CoBank (one of Talquin's lenders) has been partnering with cooperatives around the nation in their Sharing Success program to provide needed funds to charitable organizations in rural areas. Talquin applied for three of their grants again this year, and again all three were awarded!

The recipients of this year's grants were the American Red Cross Capital Area Chapter, Wakulla Senior Citizens Council, and the Hang Tough Foundation. Each of these organizations received \$1,000 from CoBank as part of their Sharing Success program. Here is some information about all three organizations and how this grant money will help our community:

The **American Red Cross** comes to the aid of our community when we are at our most vulnerable, during a disaster. However, they are also here for us when there is not a disaster. Their main objective is to help our com-

The mission of **Wakulla Senior Citizens Council** is to enable seniors to age in a friendly and secure environment to prevent premature admission to nursing homes or other institutions. Did You Know?

Returning the Patronage Capital of Deceased Members

Capital Credits belong to Talquin's Members and are on loan to Talquin Electric Cooperative for investing in operations, power restoration after outages, and construction. These funds are normally returned in later years on a regular and sound business basis. However, in the event of a Member's passing, Talquin Electric Cooperative pays out the remainder of capital credits allocated to that Member in accordance with the cooperative's By-laws and procedures. In order for those capital credits to be disbursed, a deceased Member claim needs to be filed with Talquin. To start the process, a person can visit any of our Member Services Offices to fill out an application or call and have an application mailed to them. Along with the application, a certified copy of the death certificate is required. If available, a copy of the last will and testament will help speed up the process. Each situation is different depending on the number of survivors, the estate, and if the estate has gone through probate. If the estate has not gone through probate, Talquin follows Florida State Inheritance Laws. Ingredients

3 large zucchini, sliced into 1/2" rounds

1 tsp. cumin

1/4 tsp. chili powder

1/4 tsp. smoked paprika

Kosher salt

Freshly ground black pepper

1 ½ c. shredded cooked chicken

1 c. Shredded Monterey Jack

1/2 red onion, chopped

1 avocado, cubed

Pico de Gallo

Pickled jalapeños

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 400°. Place sliced zucchini on a large baking sheet in a single layer. Toss with olive oil, cumin, chili powder, and paprika then season with salt and pepper. Bake until slightly tender, 5 minutes.
- 2. Keep zucchini rounds on the baking sheet and top with shredded chicken, Monterey Jack, and red onion. Bake until the cheese is melted and the chicken is warm throughout, about 10 more minutes.
- 3. Top zucchini nachos with avocado, pico de gallo, and pickled jalapeños.



Talquin Members Receive Scam Calls

Some Members have experienced scam calls where

the caller pretends to be from Talquin Electric Cooperative, and threatens to cut off their utilities or demands payment over the phone. They have also at times demanded green dot payments, or stated that Talquin and other utilities are demanding immediate payment. Also, be aware that scammers can "spoof" Talquin's phone number so that a Member's caller ID displays Talquin's phone number. Unfortunately, we cannot prevent this from

happening, but we want all of our Members to

be informed. Several Members have received these types of phone calls. They were told that they had a balance on their account and needed to pay it immediately or their service would be

disconnected.

Talquin Electric Cooperative will not call our Members and demand immediate payment on a utility bill. If you receive a call like this, please report it to Talquin and the proper authorities. Never give your credit card or bank information to a party that has called you.




School
