Salmon Pasta – Haitian Style

Ingredients:

- 1 red bell pepper
- 1 green bell pepper
- 5 scallions
- 1 small onion
- 2 garlic cloves or 1 tsp of minced garlic
- 1 tsp fresh thyme
- 1 Jalapeno pepper
- 2 tsp of seasoned salt
- 1 cube of Maggi seasoning
- 1 tsp of salt
- 1 tsp of black pepper
- 1 Tbsp of lemon juice
- Salmon – 1 fillet
- 1 box of fettuccine pasta

Butter sauce for pasta:

- 10 oz can of Rotel
- ½ cup of minced garlic

- 1/3 cup of butter
- 1/3 cup of olive oil
- ½ cup of chopped parsley
- grated parmesan cheese – as much as you like

Preheat oven to 400. To make the marinade for the salmon, blend the first 11 items in a food processor or blender. Add 1 Tbsp of lemon juice to salmon and then add the marinade to salmon. Let sit for 5 minutes. Bake salmon for 20 minutes, covered with foil. Remove foil and bake for additional 10 minutes uncovered.

To make the butter pasta sauce, cook garlic in olive oil until tender but not brown, add butter, stir in drained Rotel, and let cook on medium-low heat for about 2 minutes. Stir in chopped parsley



and cook for 2 more minutes on low heat and stir in the parmesan cheese. Cook pasta according to the instructions on box.

Pour butter sauce on cooked pasta and add salmon on top of pasta.... Enjoy!
