Managers Column

Talquin Electric Cooperative's wholesale power provider, Seminole Electric Cooperative (Seminole), has announced the installation of its 2.2-megawatt "Cooperative Solar" facility. Seminole has now completed construction and performance testing, and the facility is fully available to Members, including, Talquin.

Talquin Electric is pleased to participate in this program that will provide our Members with some access to the power of the sun. The facility features more than 8,000 single-axis tracking solar photovoltaic (PV) panels. This technology rotates the panels to follow the movement of the sun throughout the day, which maximizes the energy output of the facility. Each of Seminole's nine distribution electric cooperatives, including Talquin, will share the electricity generated from Cooperative Solar, giving our Members the opportunity to receive energy from the sun.

Seminole's Cooperative Solar offers Talquin the ability to add to the renewable generation mix of our portfolio. We already receive more than 13% of our energy from renewable sources, and this facility will add even more to that mix. Talquin's portion of the production from the Cooperative Solar program is expected to be more than 365,000 kWh per year, which is enough to provide electric service to about 26 homes.

This project is just the beginning. Talquin has more projects to come that will provide our Members with solar energy as part of their purchases from Talquin. We recognize that not every rooftop can host solar panels, and not every residence is practical for an on-site solar installation. Therefore, Talquin Electric is committed to providing other options, such as the Cooperative Solar program, for our Members to participate in the renewable energy market.

Member of the Month

This month, we are honored to recognize Mr. Willis "Willie" Forman as our Member of the Month. Mr. Forman has been a Talquin Member for 64 years, and boy does he have some stories to tell! Born in Mississippi during the Great Depression, he remembers what it was like to do school work in front of the fireplace since homes did not have electricity. It was a time when you shared your recently butchered cow with neighbors, because neighbors worked together to make sure everyone had enough. It was also a time of the Second World War, Mr. Forman recalls the 1940s, while working in Detroit for Continental Motors, when Uncle Sam said "I need you." Having a little flight experience, Mr. Forman was accepted into the US Army Air Corps flight school. Trained on the single-seat fighter P-51 Mustang, he was shipped out with the 47th Fighters Squadron to Iwo Jima. After the war ended, Mr. Willis headed back home to the states. He eventually moved to Tallahassee, where he had temporarily been stationed at

Dale Mabry Field during training, and married his wife Retha. Mr. Forman was an electrical engineer at Florida State University for 31 years and eventually opened his own business as an electrician. Though he did not fly for years after the war, one year for his birthday, Retha took him to Quincy for a plane ride. As Mr. Forman said "It got the old

blood stirring again," and he has been flying ever since. Mr. Forman, thank you for taking the time to share your stories with us and for being a dedicated Talquin Electric Member for 64 years and counting!

Did You Know?

Capital Credits: Joint vs. Individual Membership

Individual account holders are the sole owner of any capital credits allocated to an account. These individuals will receive a general refund check in only their name. Upon their passing, their heirs get 100% of the remaining capital credits on file (see Did You Know? article in the August edition of The Current).

Joint account holders will receive a general refund check in the name of both account holders. If one of the account holders passes away, Talquin Electric Cooperative will pay half of the capital credits on file to the appropriate surviving heir, while abiding by the Florida state inheritance laws.

Bacon-Wrapped Pickles

This recipe was just different enough that we had to share!

Ingredients

- 12 mini dill pickles
- 1 block cream cheese, softened
- 1 1/2 c. shredded Cheddar
- 1 clove garlic, chopped
- 12 slices bacon, halved

Directions

Preheat oven to 350°. Halve pickles and scoop out centers. Discard centers.

In a small bowl, stir together cream cheese, cheddar, and garlic until combined.

Spoon mixture into pickles and wrap with a half slice of bacon.

Transfer to a parchment-lined baking sheet and bake until mixture is warm and bacon is crispy, 15 minutes.

Serve immediately.
